RECOVERY ACT: NASA. This project is a collaborative effort among Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL), NASA Ames Research Center (ARC) and NASA Marshall Space Flight Center (MSFC). The overall objective of this effort is to create prototype hardware/software infrastructure to improve water management in the San Joaquin River watershed in California (scalable to other regions) that integrates NASA information products and models. MSFC component of this effort is in two distinct elements: a) generating precipitation product using data from NEXRAD radar and b) soil moisture and evapotranspiration estimation using a sophisticated distributed hydrologic model. RECOVERY ACT: NIH: *Academic Research Enhancement Award*.
